

PN program launched into Elementary Schools

At the SSNL annual general meeting held in June 2008, the Participation Nation Advisory Committee agreed that the program be launched officially to the elementary grades of 4-6. It is the rationale of the committee that in order to achieve higher participating numbers in junior high we need to keep the students engaged. The transition year from elementary school to junior high is a challenging time. For many students this means a new school environment, the onset of adolescents coupled with "trying to fit in". P.E. teachers have noted that if students are not active in extra curricular sport activities in elementary then they are less likely to join in Grade 7. The Participation Nation program begins in Grades 4-6 with Certificate and Achievement Labels. In Junior High, students graduate onto the flag pennant and collector pins. We anticipate that the positive experience achieved by the students through PN in elementary will motivate the pre teen and teen to stay involved.



All students enrolled in the Participation Nation program will receive a certificate to place their earned activity stickers. Students have a chance to earn up to 16 activity stickers. There is no cost for Certificates or stickers.
